



2016-17 STUDENT POLICIES

// UNIFORM POLICY//

This uniform policy has been created to ensure all students have the opportunity to learn and grow in an environment conducive to learning. It is our hope that holding students accountable for these expectations will continue our success in growing your children into responsible, well- rounded individuals. *

Shoes

Tuacahn High School requires that shoes be worn both in and outside the school at all times. Slippers of any kind are not allowed.

Shirts

Logo shirts in seven different colors may be purchased from our school administration office located at the high school.

HATS

Hats (of any kind) are not allowed to be worn at Tuacahn High School.

Bottoms

Jumpers, shorts, and slacks are to be in **solid navy** or **beige khaki** material. **Embellishments such as; contrast stitching, sparkles, glitter, and lace or embroidery, Split seams, and cut-off or frayed hems are NOT ALLOWED. Please NO denim of any color.** Pants can be purchased at a variety of stores in the area. Pants are to be a classic, straight-leg style. No cargo or carpenter pants will be allowed nor will pants that sag or have ornamentation. Pants with patch pockets on the front are also unacceptable. In addition, no chains will be allowed on the uniform. Jumpers must be purchased at the school. No sagging pants or low hip rider pants that expose under wear are allowed.

Other Requirements

Body piercing is limited to ears only. No other piercing will be allowed if the piercing is visible or a distraction. Jewelry must also be modest, safe, and of a non-distraction style. Jewelry must be modest, safe, and of a non-distraction style. No more than two items of jewelry may be worn on any body part (i.e. neck, fingers, wrists, etc.) No uniform embellishments, scarves or decorative pins may be worn. Violations of this policy will be documented and if a student is non-compliant, he/she will be sent home to change immediately. Multiple offenses of this policy by any student may result in disciplinary action.

Outerwear

When outerwear is worn, outerwear must have the school logo. Outerwear can be purchased at the school.

To ensure that all students meet our high expectations, the following rules will be observed:

- Shirts will be worn modestly in at all times. No tied up waist wraps or arm length modifications are allowed. Please help with this procedure by making sure your child is properly attired upon entering the school.
- All undershirts must be plain colors (no writing or graphics permissible).
- Shorts and skirts must be worn at knee length or longer.
- Undergarments cannot be exposed while standing, sitting or bending over.
- Students are required to dress out for P.E. The school will provide a shirt. Shorts are provided by the students.
- On special dress-up days, if a student is not dressing in appropriate "theme" clothing they must wear their regular uniform. Free dress standards must be modest and not distracting to the instructional setting. This includes jewelry. No chains will be allowed.
- Hair must be of a color that occurs naturally in human nature. Hair should be styled in a way that is not deemed a distraction to others. Multiple hair coloring is prohibited.
- In all dress, professionalism and appropriateness will be expected.

* Note: The Principal may make exceptions to the above policy for personal, religious or medical reasons.

If a student is non-compliant with the uniform policy they will be sent home to change immediately. Violations will be documented and if a student has multiple incidences of non-compliance, additional disciplinary actions will be enforced.

// STUDENT ATTENDANCE //

The complete Tuacahn High School Attendance Policy is available upon request. This is a summary.

The Tuacahn High School Administration wants to make every effort to be in compliance with State law and work together with the Fifth District Juvenile Court and city of Ivins Police Department to encourage the regular attendance of all Tuacahn High School students. We believe this to be in the best interest of the students and the community. The Tuacahn High School Administration, together with the Tuacahn High School Board of Directors, is committed to work in harmony with the parents and to assist them with their responsibility to have their children in attendance at the high school.

1. The law mandates compulsory education requirements for all students who are of K-12 age and classification. It is the parent/legal guardian responsibility to make every effort to comply with this law.
2. The law allows parents of students enrolled in public schools to excuse their students from school, but only when the student is absent for a "legitimate reason" such as illness or family emergency. This determination will be made by school officials. Reasons given may be challenged by school officials. Parents are given 48 hours to excuse an absence, after which time it becomes an 'unexcused' absence and must be made up with restitution hours.

DEFINITIONS:

Tardy: A tardy is defined as reporting to class after the bell to start class has sounded. All tardies are reported to the attendance office. A tardy is valid for the first twenty (20) minutes of class, after which it is an absence.

1. It is the student's and parent's responsibility to monitor tardiness with SIS2000+, through Progress Reports, and by communication with the teacher.
2. Excessive tardiness may result in any or all of the following: 1) teacher/student meeting; 2) a teacher/student/parent meeting; 3) a student/parent meeting with an administrator

Absence: An absence is defined as any time a student is not in attendance in the classroom to which he or she has been assigned.

1. There are four types of absences; 1) Excused absences; 2) Unexcused absences; 3) Truancy; 4) Exempt absence.
 - A. Excused absences are absences excused by a parent/legal guardian or school official.
 - B. Unexcused absences are absences that are not excused and will be counted as one point for restitution purposes.
 - C. Truancy (sluffing) is an absence that is not excused by a parent or school official. Truancy is classified as willful disobedience of mandatory attendance laws.
 - D. Exempt absences qualify as excused absences for educational travel, school related activity, homebound absence, illness or court/detention absences. Doctors/dentists notes must be on file in the office.All course work and class assignments required during absences are the responsibility of the student to complete in consultation with teachers and their policies. If a parent checks a student out of school and the time out of class is longer than twenty minutes in duration it will count as an absence.

Point System:

T - Tardy = .25 pt.

P - Excused Absence = 0-5=0 pt. 1pt per absence after five (5)

X - Unexcused absence = 1 pt.

S - Truant = 1 pt. Mandatory restitution.

O - Restitution = 1 hour equals 1 pt. (1 hr. unexcused replaced, hour for hour)

No Grades (NG):

Six (6) points in a single class during the same term will result in the withholding of the grade and the credit for that class. Restitution/teacher resolution must be completed before credit is given. Students will have the first eight (8) weeks of the following semester to make up restitution for NG's.

Parental notification will occur the first time a student accumulates 5 points or the equivalent in any one class within a term. Restitution will be required in order to earn the release of grades and credit being withheld.

Students/Parents may appeal any of the above Attendance Policy guidelines by presenting a written statement with appeal reasons to the Principal within the time frame of each term. The Principal will review the appeal and issue a final ruling. If the student/parent disagrees with the ruling, they may submit an appeal to the Board of Directors within two weeks of receiving the decision of the Principal.

Point Scale Policy:

5 Attendance Points - The school contacts the parent/guardian by telephone, mail or in person.

8 Attendance Points - The school contacts the parent/guardian and a conference meeting is held by a school administrator.

10 Attendance Points - A Parent Conference is held and a contract is written for compliance.

20 Attendance Points - Contract not fulfilled.....the school will send all documentation to Juvenile Court for educational neglect/truancy.

With a history of attendance non-compliance, Tuacahn High School disciplinary action may occur.

// DISCIPLINE POLICY //

The basis of Tuacahn High School's discipline policy is to provide a safe and orderly environment for each student to learn. We wish to provide a school free from violence, harassment, intimidation, substance abuse, bullying, or any gang related activity which will disrupt the orderly and safe operation of the school. Categories of discipline are listed from the least severe to the most severe. With any disciplinary action, staff members shall consider all mitigating circumstances and provide appropriate due process for each student. Mitigating circumstances include, but are not limited to, the following factors:

- prior conduct
- impact upon the safety or well-being of faculty/students
- attitude and honesty of student
- age, health, and maturity of student
- seriousness of offense
- cooperation of parents
- willingness to make restitution
- compliance with local, state, and federal laws

All types of misconduct and related criminal behavior are prohibited whether listed specifically or not and violators shall be subject to the discretionary authority of the principal or his/her designee. All disciplinary actions for misconduct shall include a conference between the principal or his/her designee and the student, followed as soon as is reasonably practical by notification to parent(s) or guardian.

Any student wishing to transfer to Tuacahn High School who has been suspended from another secondary school for disciplinary reasons will **not** be admitted to Tuacahn High School until a thorough review of the student's prior conduct is evaluated by the administration. To abide by legal mandates of the "Safe School Act," any potential student who has been convicted of drug, alcohol, theft, or any other serious infraction of the law, will be subject to discipline policy provisions, which may include **non-admission** to Tuacahn High School. Students and/or parents are required to disclose this information. If this information is not disclosed upon application for admission to Tuacahn High School, but discovered subsequent to enrollment at Tuacahn High School, the student will be immediately **suspended** until the administration is informed of said offenses and a final disciplinary decision is reached according to Tuacahn High School policies.

STUDENT MISCONDUCT - LEVEL 1

These acts of misconduct include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Loitering
2. Profane, obscene, indecent, immoral, or seriously offensive language and gestures, indecent propositions, or exhibitions.
3. Involvement in criminal gang activity/apparel - II
4. Displaying any behavior that is seriously disruptive to the learning environment
5. Failing to provide proper identification or information
6. Insubordination and/or defiance
7. Fighting - two people, no injuries - I, II
8. Bullying - III, V
9. Sexual harassment (verbal, written, physical or silent) - I
10. Public display of affection
11. Possession of any electronic device that disrupts the learning environment
12. Failure to wear proper school dress standards - IV
13. Inappropriate behavior with a THS host family
14. Cheating/Plagiarism/Copying (Non-Original Work) - I
15. Attendance Violations

I - The school contacts the parent/guardian by telephone, mail or in person requesting a conference with all appropriate parties, as needed. Dependent on the situation, a student contract will be signed.

II - Searches may be involved with reasonable suspicion regarding, but not limited to: weapons, drugs, student/school safety, etc., as determined by the administrator.

III - Students who have been identified, through reasonable documentation by administration, who have participated in bullying, will not retaliate, harass any students, parents or staff members for reporting.

IV - The principal, at any time, can grant an exception to the dress standards for extenuating circumstances (53A-15-602)

V - Bullying reporting is done through: word of mouth, StopIt app, HOPE squad, email or other forms of communication. The school has in place an anti-bullying program, supported and run through the school, to educate and report all behavior. All students and staff (including part-time and hourly) were trained to respond and use the StopIt app and other methods of reporting for any violation. This includes, but is not limited to: cyber-bullying, hazing, social-media, emotional, and physical bullying/aggression. The use of this app by students, helps administrators and counselors allows document for all reported incidents. Those resources are located at: <https://stopitcyberbully.com/resources>

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

First Violation:

- Minimum: Student/Administrator Conference
- Maximum: Suspension (up to ten school days)

Repeated or Flagrant/Serious Violation:

- Minimum: Student/Parent/Administrator Conference
- Maximum: Suspension (up to 180 school days) in accordance with federal and state law

* In addition to these penalties, provisions for the Utah Criminal Code are applicable to illegal behavior. The principal is required to report all illegal activities to the police. Any disciplinary action taken by the School Administrator is independent of any criminal proceedings or decisions.

* The student may be suspended from THS for at least 180 days in accordance with state and federal law unless the administrator determines that a lesser punishment is more appropriate.

STUDENT MISCONDUCT - LEVEL 2

These acts of misconduct include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Criminal Activity
2. Theft
3. Possession of a weapon (real or simulated)
4. Assaults
5. Fighting - with injury or injuries or involving two or more people
6. Trespassing
7. Intimidation and/or threat of violence or bullying
8. Physical sexual harassment (includes exposure, etc.)
9. Use of an incendiary device
10. Possession or use of tobacco
11. Possession or use of alcohol and/or controlled substance
12. Inappropriate behavior with a host family

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

First Violation:

- Minimum: Student/Parent/Administrative conference, suspension (up to ten school days)
- Maximum: Suspension (up to 180 school days) in accordance with federal and state law

Repeated or Flagrant/Serious Violations:

- Minimum: Student/Parent/Administrative conference, suspension (up to ten school days)
- Maximum: Suspension (up to 180 school days) in accordance with federal and state law

*In addition to these penalties, provisions for the Utah Criminal Code are applicable illegal behavior.

*All staff members, as mandatory reporters, are required to report the following, but not limited to, the proper authorities: suicide threat or behavior, any/all illegal activity, threat of self-harm, threat of harming others, threat of harming school, safety of school and all personnel and students.

STUDENT MISCONDUCT – LEVEL 3

These acts of misconduct include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Possession of a firearm
2. Use of a weapon (real or simulated)
3. Aggravated assault
4. Arson
5. Extortion
6. Sexual Assault
7. Placing any person in imminent danger
8. Alcohol
9. Controlled substance

DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Parents and police will be notified and the student will remain indefinitely suspended during the investigative process. If evidence concludes, including the student/s due process, the student can be suspended for 180 school days as required by State Code 53A-11-904 (1)(a)(iv) or (1)(a)(v).

STATEMENT ON ALCOHOL, CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES AND TOBACCO USE

Tuacahn High School prohibits any student use, possession, sale, distribution of, or being under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances, imitation controlled substances, and/or other similarly harmful substances, or drug paraphernalia. Similarly, the Tuacahn High School prohibits any student use, possession, sale or distribution of any tobacco/tobacco products. These policies and administrative procedures apply to action of students during school hours, before and after school while on school property, while traveling in vehicles authorized by the school, at all school sponsored events, and when actions affect the mission or operation of the Tuacahn High School.

RECORD OF POLICY VIOLATIONS

Policy violations are cumulative. The records of clearly substantiated violations of this policy noting date, type of violation, and disciplinary action taken will be kept in the students' discipline record. Record of violations from previous schools concerning behaviors identified in the DISCIPLINE POLICY will be taken into account before a student requesting transfer to Tuacahn High School is considered for enrollment.

STUDENT RIGHT OF DUE PROCESS

It is expected that the majority of problems arising in our school can be solved through consultation between student, teacher, parent, and school administrator. When student behavior or actions are sufficiently disruptive as to interfere with the educational process, appropriate action must be taken.

The Fourteenth Amendment of the Constitution assures students the right of due process. The procedures for due process are designed to protect the rights of students and employees when a problem arises. The process is an administrative action, not a judicial action. Due process requires promptness, fairness, and reasonableness in all actions, which includes the right to 1) note of offenses or charges, 2) statement of evidence, and 3) the opportunity to respond to offenses or charges. If the student insists upon representation by an attorney, the high school administration must be notified at least forty-eight hours in advance so that the TCA/High School legal counsel may be in attendance.

PROCEDURE FOR APPEALS/GRIEVANCE

A parent/guardian of a student aggrieved by a suspension or discipline decision may request a review of the decision by using the following procedure:

1. Discuss the grievance with the teacher or person at the school with whom the disagreement occurred. If no agreement is reached, the parent/guardian may:
2. Meet with the principal/administrator of Tuacahn High School. If no agreement is reached, the parent/guardian may:
3. Meet with the Disciplinary Executive Committee (consisting of 3 members comprised of faculty/staff, PTO, and C.O.O. of Tuacahn Center for the Arts). The decision of this committee may also be appealed on a final basis by the parent/guardian who may then appeal by submitting a written:
4. Request for a hearing before the Tuacahn Board of Directors. The Board will grant a hearing, and the meeting shall be in executive session with at least four members present. Following the hearing in executive session, the Board shall give its final decision in writing **within 10 days.**

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Aggravated assault - to intentionally cause serious bodily injury to another or use of a dangerous weapon or other force likely to produce death or serious bodily injury.

Arson - the act of knowingly, by means of fire or explosive device, damaging a building and/or the personal property of others.

Assault: Harmful, or offensive physical contact between two people without the consent of both individuals, including touching,.....whether or not touching is actually intended. May or may not be sexual in nature.

Controlled substance - any drug delivered by a pharmacist to an ultimate user under a lawful prescription.

Criminal activity - any activity that violates applicable criminal codes.

Disciplinary reassignment - disciplinary action involving transfer to another room or school or alternative school placement for a specified period of time.

Due process - notification to the student and the parent/legal guardian of the time and place for a hearing and a statement of the alleged act(s) of misconduct. Due process includes the right to a hearing, the right to counsel, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses, and the right to appeal.

Expulsion - removal of student from school by the Board of Directors.

Extortion - obtaining money, information or personal property from another by coercion or intimidation.

Fighting - physical conflict between two or more individuals.

Firearms - any pistol, revolver, rifle (see also weapons).

Gang activity/apparel - wearing of bandannas, headgear or any article of clothing or jewelry bearing any gang symbols, names, initials, insignia or anything else which signals gang affiliation and/or worn for the purpose of signifying gang membership. This includes gang signing.

Graffiti - see criminal activity

Incendiary device - any device designed to cause combustion or fire.

Indecent proposition - an unsolicited sexual or otherwise offensive proposal.

In-school suspension - the student remains in school. All privileges are suspended; classes are not attended. The action may be recorded in the student's folder. The student remains in a supervised location where work is provided, but regular school freedoms are severely limited.

Intimidation - engaging in behavior which prevents or discourages another student from exercising his/her right to education. Such prohibited behavior includes the use of threats, coercion, or force.

Loitering - occupying an unauthorized place on or near the school grounds, property or activities.

Mitigating - to make less severe.

Parent(s) - biological parents, foster parents, or legal guardians.

Possession - physical control over real or personal property.

Prohibited medication substances - prescription and over-the-counter medication in excess of a recommended 8-hour dosage.

School days - one of the regularly scheduled 180 days in a school year.

School property - school buildings and lands owned by Tuacahn which include traveling in vehicles funded by Tuacahn and any areas rented or leased by Tuacahn and areas in and around any school sponsored event.

Simulated weapon - to represent, give, or assume the appearance of or the effect of, a real weapon.

Suspension - involuntary temporary removal of a student from school attendance and activities. A student may be charged with trespassing if present on school grounds during the period of suspension.

Theft - to obtain or exercise unauthorized control over the property of another.

Tobacco - shall include cigarettes, cigars, pipes, smokeless or other tobacco products in any form.

Use, possession, sale, distribution of alcohol, drugs, controlled substances and imitation controlled substances - shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Utah Controlled Substances Act, the Utah Drug Paraphernalia Act, the Imitation Controlled Substances Act, and the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act or any successor acts thereto of the Utah Code.

Weapons - any item that in its manner of use or intended use is capable of causing death or serious bodily injury including, but not limited to, shotguns, BB-guns, sling-shots, all knives, and all items containing gun powder or any other explosive or flammable material.

SAFETY/SAFE SCHOOL

- Tuacahn High School for the Performing Arts recognizes that every student has the right to gain an education in an environment that is safe, free from unnecessary disruption, and conducive to the learning process. To foster this environment, the following principles apply:
 1. Each student is expected to follow accepted rules of conduct.
 2. Each student is expected to show respect for other people and obey those in authority at the school.
 3. This policy will apply to all students in the classroom, on the school campus, in school vehicles, and in school-related activities.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

- Federal Law prohibits sexual harassment of any kind by students or employees of Tuacahn High School for the Performing Arts. Examples of sexual harassment include jokes, physical gestures, inappropriate physical contact, negative or offensive comments or any other written, verbal, or visual material that is humiliating or derisive, or that creates an uncomfortable work or learning environment. Violations should be reported. Following an investigation, appropriate disciplinary action will be taken.
- Public displays of affection in school and on campus are a distraction to education and are considered a form of sexual harassment. If observed or reported, a verbal warning will be issued on the first offense. Subsequent offense will result in additional disciplinary action.

FIRE DRILLS

- In accordance with State Law and by recommendation of the Fire Marshall, four fire drills will be held randomly throughout the school year. For the safety of all, staff members and students are expected to follow the drill plan as posted in each classroom.

TELEPHONE USE

- A telephone is provided for student use to make local calls in case of emergency. Calls may only be made before school, after school, and during lunch. Please see additional cell phone policy.

Cell Phone, I-Pod/Listening Device Use Policy at Tuacahn High School

1. Cellular Phones and I-Pods/Listening Devices will not be allowed in class during instructional hours at Tuacahn High School.
2. Cell Phone and I-Pod/Listening Device use will be restricted to time prior to the beginning bell of school in the morning, during lunch, and after school hours only.
3. Students seeking emergency assistance or transportation arrangements may use the local call phones located near the main school office.
4. Cell phone use has become a distraction to the teaching process and text messaging has become a source of cheating at many secondary schools in the United States. This action will not be tolerated at Tuacahn High School.
5. Students found using any of these electronic devices during instructional hours (including in rest rooms) will be warned and may be suspended in-house for one day. Parents will be notified. The device will be confiscated and returned to the student/parent at the end of the day.
6. Second time offenders will be suspended from Tuacahn High School for a full day.
7. Third time offenders will be suspended for ten days of school.
8. Fourth time offenders will be suspended for the balance of the school year.

EXCEPTIONS

Exceptions to the above policy may include I-pod/Listening Device use with written instructor approval for class assignments or research purposes only. Any other exceptions must be approved by the Principal on an individual basis.

LOST AND FOUND

- Items found throughout the campus will be brought to the office and placed in lost and found where they will be held for one week. If items are not claimed or the owner is not found, they will be donated to a local charity.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES/COPIES

- Copies can be made in the front office of the school for 10 cents per page/copy. Please check with office staff.

CLOSED CAMPUS

- Tuacahn High School is a closed campus and students are expected to stay on site throughout the entire school day. This is to include the lunch period.
- Students who do not attend Tuacahn High School may not be on campus, or in the parking lot, during school hours. Violations will be considered trespassing and will be handled as such.
- Guests who wish to spend a day at school to observe classes may do so if authorized through administration one day prior to the visit. If authorized, a guest pass will be issued. Guests must have, or will be assigned, a host to assist them throughout the day.

LOCKERS

- Lockers are school property and are issued to students for storage of school books and school equipment. One school-issued lock will also be assigned for each locker and are the only locks that are to be placed on the locker. No personal locks are to be used. If the lock is lost or damaged, there will be a \$5.00 charge to replace it.
- Students are responsible for keeping their lockers neat and clean both inside and out. They must not write on, scratch, carve, dent, or in any way deface or mutilate their lockers or anyone else's locker. Students who violate these regulations will lose locker privileges and will be required to make payment sufficient to cover damages.
- Administration reserves the right to search any or all lockers. Illegal items found in lockers may be confiscated, and students to whom the lockers are assigned may be prosecuted.
- The school is not responsible for stolen items. It is strongly suggested that no items of value or large amounts of money are left in the lockers or brought to school.
- Because the lockers are located outside of the building in a natural setting with animals, no food is to be stored in the lockers. Any food items brought to school for lunch or other reasons should be left in the front office. At the end of each day, any unclaimed food items will be discarded.

TEXTBOOKS

- Students are responsible for the return and proper care of their textbooks. Students will be required to pay replacement costs for any lost or damaged book. Any damage to the book that exists upon receipt of the book

needs to be brought to the attention of the teacher immediately. Otherwise, the student may be expected to pay for the damage when it is later returned.

SKATEBOARDS/BICYCLES

- Skates (roller blades), skateboards are prohibited throughout the entire campus. At no time should a student have skates or skateboards at school. If one is brought to school, the skates or skateboard will be confiscated.
- Bicycles may be used for transportation to and from school but may not be ridden on campus at any other time.

LIBRARY/INTERNET

- Use of the Internet is an integral part of education. A media center is available for student use but a substantial amount of research and class work is done on the computer. Before a student is issued a password for access and before a student can use a computer, an Acceptable Use Policy must be signed by a parent/guardian and a copy must be filed with the media specialist. All guidelines set forth by the Acceptable Use Policy will be followed. Failure to comply will result in the revocation of computer privileges as well as additional disciplinary action, as needed.

CLUBS

Tuacahn High School for the Performing Arts has the following clubs:

- Drama Club
- Science Club
- Dance Company
- Art Club
- Film Club Interact (affiliated with Rotary International)
- National Honor Society
- Star Wars Club

Additional clubs will be considered based on student interest and need. **All clubs must have an approved purpose and must have an adult advisor from the Tuacahn High School staff** as well as a constitution setting forth the purpose and guidelines of the club.

EXTRACURRICULAR

- All performances and competitions are considered extracurricular activities. Students must be eligible to participate under the guidelines set by the Utah High School Activities Association. A student must be in attendance in class at least one-half day (two class periods) the day of a rehearsal, practice, or competition in order to participate on that day. (Refer to Policy.)

ELIGIBILITY

- It is expected that all students who participate in extracurricular activities and performances maintain high academic and citizenship standards. Those standards include, but are not exclusive to, the following:
 - a) A 2.5 grade point average for the current and previous quarters;
 - b) No major disciplinary action for the current and previous quarters;
 - c) No N/G's for the current and previous quarters;
 - d) Fewer than ten absences for the current and previous quarter
 - e) In attendance at least four class periods on the day of participation;
